Scopolamine Patch

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Why do I need this medicine?

The scopolamine patch is to help you feel less sick to your stomach (nausea).

How do I use this patch?



- Keep the patch dry so it will not fall off.
- If you touch the patch, be sure and wash your hands with soap and water.
- Try not to get any of the medicine in your eye. If you get it in your eye you may not be able to see well. If you have trouble seeing, call your health care provider.
- Take the patch off if you:
 - Have trouble peeing (urinating).
 - Have pain or redness in your eyes.
- Do not swim while wearing your patch.
- After you have worn the patch for 3 days, take it off and throw it away. If your nausea (feeling sick to your stomach) has gone away, you can take the patch off before 3 days.
- After you take off the patch, wash behind your ear with soap and water. Fold the patch in half with the sticky sides together, and put it in the trash so that children and pets cannot get to it. Wash your hands well with soap and water.
